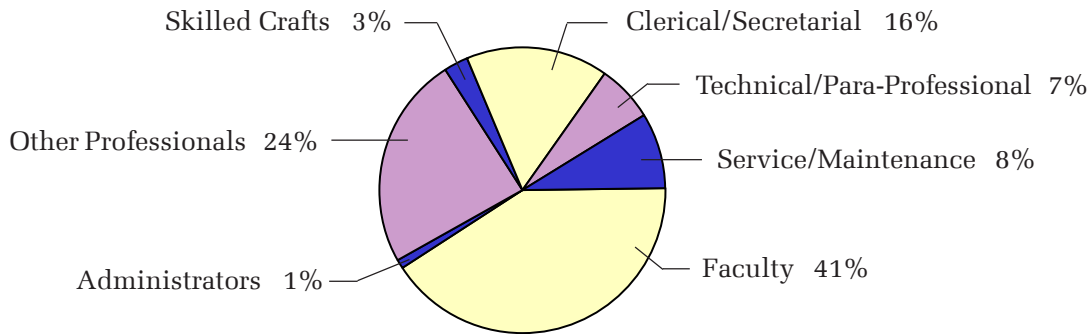

UO Endowed Chairs and Professorships

Endowed faculty positions make a tremendous difference in the university's ability to retain top faculty members and to recruit new professors who bring fresh perspectives to campus. When a donor establishes an endowed chair or professorship, the endowment is invested, with only a portion of the investment earnings spent for the position. The annual allocation can be used to supplement a professor's salary and provide funds for such purposes as hiring graduate assistants or interns, or for travel, research, or supplies.

At least 129 current UO faculty members have been named Fulbright Scholars, at least 41 have been named Guggenheim Fellows, 9 are members of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, and 5 are members of the National Academy of Sciences.

¹ Includes all Faculty, Officers of Administration, and Classified employee positions (including post-retirement appointments) receiving pay as of October 31, 2006. Post-retirement appointments total 96 Faculty, 29 Officers of Administration, and 10 Classified. Does not include 1,286 Graduate Assistants, 2,466 student employees, or 262 temporary employees. (Temporary appointments are support staff typically working less than 6 months.) Does not include courtesy appointments.
